Recommendations for Action for 2005

- Camp Mack is worth every penny! We believe we want to keep the commitment to Mission Village despite the fact that our numbers didn't warrant the extra space in 2004. We believe that the three separate camp areas will enable further growth, and allow us to take advantage of the best accommodations Camp Mack has to offer.
- The camp staff is a wonderful asset to the diocese. Most members volunteer a week of their time to the youth of the diocese. Early recruiting helped create the opportunity for a larger number of youth to attend camp, however, we have still struggled to find an adequate number of adult male counselors. This could restrict the number of boy campers in the future.
- The follow-up party at our house was/is a great fellowship experience. We think it creates a community of people that want to return for the following summer, and sometimes draws new people into the group.
- Thank you, Greg Croyle, for the amazing database program! ! !!! (This system would have possibilities for other diocesan ministries.) In 2005 we hope to expand its capabilities.
- We recommend keeping the staff Eucharist as a kick-off to the week.
- In 2005, we plan to send camp registration forms to each of the previous year's campers, as well as the standard packet sent to each parish in 2004. There continues to be a lack of communication... many young adults, adults, and potential campers were unaware of this wonderful opportunity the diocese offers. We need parish level involvement (possibly in the form of slide show promotions, personal testimonies, or short skits) to recruit new campers, and to notify them of scholarship options.
- This year, a creative solution to a lack of priest involvement was to have a "Priest of the Day". Fr. Ben Jones, Fr. Dick Kallenberg, and Fr. David Ottsen all took part in a day at camp and ministering to camper needs. Bishop Little was also present for most of the week. Fr. Charlie Deaton (Mississippi) was the musical headliner and program emcee. We hope to have a larger number of parish clergy commit to being at camp in 2005.
- The diocesan website was a valuable tool in supplying various forms and information for camp.
